The North Forest Independent School District Police Department was given approval for a juvenile processing office by the Harris County Parole Board on April 28, 2010. The Juvenile Board Meeting was held at noon at the Harris County Youth Village, located at 210 J.W. Mills Dr., Seabrook, TX.

North Forest Independent School District Police Department was on the agenda for the approval of a Juvenile Processing Office located at 8600 Little York, room # 105 (Conference Room)

Every person who takes a child into custody must fully comply with '52.02 and '52.025 of the Family Code. The Family code requires a child in custody be taken to a designated juvenile processing center without unnecessary delay.

By obtaining a designated processing center, the North Forest ISD Police Department is now in compliance with the Texas Commission on Jail Standard, Texas Family Code and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act.

This accomplishment brings North Forest ISD Police Department one step closer to being a recognized police agency and allows us to provide better services to our district's constituents.
